Take a Walk with a Local

On Friday the 25th of October, the mega team have organised some enthusiastic locals to act as guides on some <u>popular tracks and routes</u> each with great caches to find. If you're not from Auckland, or even if you are and you've wanted to tackle some of these, then please take this opportunity to join in and tag along.

There are lots of fantastic locations and trails to go geocaching around the Auckland region, so we chose 4 that we think showcase some great scenery, terrain, and varied geocaching. Each walk includes ratings for safety and terrain, so please check them out and be aware of your own limits – these walks are free, and by participating, you accept all risks, as you normally would when out geocaching.

You can sign up for these walks, for free, at our online mega store. Please make sure you indicate the number in your group. While there will be no cost to join in the fun, we will limit the numbers in order to try and keep everyone safe – the local guides as well as yourselves. Your email details will be passed onto the local guide so that they can make arrangements directly with you.

Atiu Creek

Situated on the shores of the expansive Kaipara Harbour, north of Auckland, is the Atiu Creek Regional Park, opened in 2008. Geocachers can enjoy a pleasant 8.5km (approx) easy loop walk taking in some lovely scenery and a series of over 30 geocaches.

Pararaha Gorge/Karekare Beach

The most extreme of our guided walks (but not the most extreme available in Auckland), this route will take the more adventurous souls down a gorge in the Waitakere Ranges and out onto stunning west coast beaches. Outdoors confidence and a head for heights is a must as there are caches on this trip rated at T4 and above. Numbers will be strictly limited for this trek, but for those who brave it, the rewards will be an adventure and scenery that they will NEVER forget.

Okura Bush Walkway

The Okura Bush Walkway stretches from just north of Long Bay around the coast through lush bush and Kauri forest and ends in the village of Stillwater. It is a popular 8km <u>bush walk</u> with lovely scenery. Those who choose this option are also rewarded with 35+ great geocaches.

Rangitoto Island

An iconic feature of Auckland's landscape, Rangitoto Island is the most recent of the volcanoes in the region. It is so young that it has not yet been able to generate a top-soil layer to support typical ground vegetation. It is home, however, to the largest Pohutukawa forest in the world. If you choose this option, you will have the choice of a morning return trip to the summit (approx 12 geocaches) or a loop walk taking in the summit and the western shore of the island (approx 21 geocaches).

Registration numbers are building rapidly, but it's not too late to join in the fun. In fact, now would be a great time to get your registration details in as it will help us forecast what we need (or more accurately how much we will need) on the day to cater for you all.

Important **Registration Info**

Pre-registering is important, and it's important that we get all the information from you that we need to make the event a huge success and run smoothly while that happens.

If you have paid for your registration but haven't filled out and confirmed your registration on the mega website, please do so as it helps us square up the numbers of registered attendees. If our emails to you include a "personal express registration" link, then chances are we need you to click on that link and then click the Register button.

If you have registered but not paid, please head over to the online store and make payment as it is very important that we pay all the bills for putting on this event.
